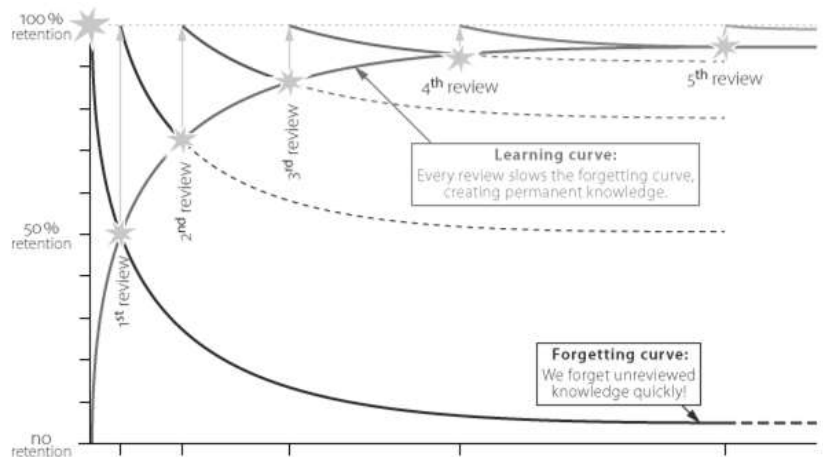
Need convincing?

Use these codes to keep track of the revision techniques you are using. Every week, you should also revisit the topics from previous weeks.

Either repeat the same activity you did previously to consolidate that knowledge, or choose another activity to deepen your understanding.

Once you have worked your way through the content, you should reflect on which topics you are the least confident on. Introduce those as your new focus. Continue this process.

This means you will build up to revising multiple topics each week. Remember: spreading it out into chunks is better than revising for 5 hours straight!



F – Flashcards

'Tutor2u Revision Flashcards' are available on Microsoft Teams for you to download and use whenever you want. This technique is much more effective if you have someone else to test you on the flashcard content, so independent study periods are a great time to do this.

R – Politics Review

U – Politics Annual Updates

UK and US 'Politics Annual Update' books are available on Microsoft Teams for you to download and use whenever you want. They date back to 2017. Find and read chapters that are relevant to the topic you are revising. Check the 'Revision' section of Microsoft Teams to help streamline this process.

E – Essays

Don't just be passive in your revision. Use that knowledge in an active way and it will embed into your memory more effectively. The best way to do this is to write an evaluative essay.

Y – Youtube.com

Not all revision requires reading. Watch a video about politics before you get up in the morning, when you're on the bus, or between adverts when you're watching television? Youtube.com is a fantastic resource if you know where to look. Check the 'Revision' section of Microsoft Teams to help streamline this process.

P – Podcasts

Listen to experts talk politics when you're out for a jog, doing the washing-up or before you go to bed. Podcasts are a fantastic resource if you know where to look. Check the 'Revision' section of Microsoft Teams to help streamline this process.

O – Other

You will have your own ideas about how best to revise. If you choose another path, log it on your revision timetable!

Dual-coding
